Accommodation

Following on from months of consultation, negotiation and setbacks a number of issues are at last nearing resolution:


The transfer of a small area of land from Fingal Co. Council to St. Lawrence Trust (owners of the site on which the school is built) is necessary in order for the school extension project to get the go ahead. Because of land registration issues on the part of Fingal, the transfer was stalled. It now appears that Fingal has, at last, got its registration papers in order. There are other technical terms and conditions being worked out between the two legal teams but these will soon be resolved.

During mid term I was in contact with DES Capital Appraisal Unit to get assurance that money pledged last April (€708,800) was still ring fenced and to press for funding towards additional costs (inflation / rising construction costs / demolition extras / site abnormal charges etc.). The official in charge indicated that she is to move our project for approval – but has since indicated that this could take anything up to 10 weeks.

In order to fund any hidden costs of the building I met with Jenny Hutton, Ashley Wright, Sandra O'Rourke, Ashley Sheridan and Marina Fagan to set up a Build A Brick fundraising campaign. We will call it 'A Pathway through Primary' – invoking the journey undertaken by our pupils from Junior Infants to 6th class while also representing the physical pathway made by sponsored engraved bricks. A number of teachers are to be co-opted on to the team. Details later.

Standardised Testing

Annual Standardised testing for 1st—6th will take place in May. Please endeavour to have your child present at school and if for any reason your child will be absent please inform the class teacher in advance. The teachers of pupils in sacrament classes will be working around their busy schedule so may have to do them at a later date. The two tests being administered will be the Sigma T testing mathematical skills and the Drumcondra Reading test which tests reading, vocabulary and comprehension.
