## Accommodation

Our revised plans for a four classroom extension is now due for final approval by the Department of Education and Skills **Building & Planning** Unit. We can expect construction to begin four months later (to allow for tendering/health & safety schedules to take place). Officials from the Department have assured me that our file is at the upper end of a queue of school building projects and that we will be immediately informed when it has been signed off.

Our school architect has

advised us that all school building projects incur hidden costs which are not covered by the basic building grant. We have set up a team to spearhead a two year fundraising campaign—Pathway through Primary which will be launched at our first major event—a Golf Classic—on September 21st 2018, our central drive will be to offer parents/ grandparents/guardians and past pupils a choice a buy a sponsored brick to fund these hidden costs and to develop sport, IT
