General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

GDPR came into force on 25th May 2018. GDPR emphasizes transparency, security and accountability with regard to the processing of personal data. In all schools Boards of Management undertake the role of Data Controllers. Our school has a Data Protection Policy in place, and is working to carry out the requirements of GDPR.

Data Protection Regulation is high profile and quite complex. There is very user-friendly information about it on the website of the (Irish) Data Protection Commission. This information is kept securely on our server and is also provided to two outside bodies; the Department of Education and Science and the third party to which we outsource our attendance

and related administration.

As per the GDPR guidelines, we are reviewing our policy on school photography and a school website privacy statement.

The data we acquire and keep is centered around your children, who are the business of the school. We keep personal, academic and peripheral data relating to children and their parents / guardians and carers. This data relates both to current and past pupils. We also keep data relating to staff, current and those who have left.

We retain personal data for only as long as is necessary for contractual, legal or business purposes. When personal data is no longer required we securely destroy it
