Our Child Protection Safeguarding Statement was reviewed last month. A copy of the Child Protection Safeguarding Statement plus Risk — Assessment document is on display in the school reception area (adjacent to the office of the School Secretary). Copies have been posted on the school website— www.howthprimaryschool.ie —and are available on request. Copies of the CP Safeguarding Statement have been sent to the Parents' Association and to the school's Patron.

Many school personnel/PA/Board of Management members have undertaken Child Protection training. New staff and other school personnel who may not yet have completed CP training are encouraged to do so.

Teachers in the school include Stay Safe / Social, Personal & Health Education (SPHE) and Sexuality modules (RSE) in their planning. A training night for parents presented by the Child Abuse Prevention Programme (CAPP) took place before Christmas.

DLP conducted Child Protection / Stay Safe programme survey with eight classes throughout the school as part of the recent CP Safeguarding Statement review.
